- F. All bids must be received by 2:00 PM, September 22, 2022. Then bids will be publicly opened and read. Any bid received after closing time will be returned unopened.
- G. Bid Form
 - 1. Bidders must utilize the bid proposal form provided on TxDOT's website. The latest bid form will be labeled as revised, if the bid form is revised.
 - 2. Bidders must provide pricing for the Base Bid and all Alternates. The contract award will be based on the lowest qualified bid plus any combinations of alternates.
 - 3. All blanks in the bid form filled in electronically. Handwritten bid forms will be considered non-responsive. The bid form is best accessed with Adobe per TxDOT.
 - 4. Addenda acknowledged. Handwritten acknowledgement of addenda, in excess of 3, is required, as the bid form only has three spots available for addenda.
 - 5. Bid form signed, original in ink.
 - 6. Bid form qualifications acknowledged and signed or prequalification letter enclosed.
- H. Bidder Responsiveness Checklist
 - 1. Meet all requirements associated with the bid form.
 - 2. 2% Bid Bond included with bid.
 - 3. HUB Subcontracting Plan form (HSP). The HSP must be submitted with the bid.

- 2. Bidders, including State of Texas certified Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUBs), will be required to complete and submit a HUB Subcontracting Plan (HSP) with their bid.
- 3. IF THE HSP IS NOT INCLUDED WITH YOUR BID, YOUR BID WILL BE DEEMED NON-RESPONSIVE.
- 4. Respondents are encouraged to maximize HUB utilization equal to the statewide HUB goals for the type of work being contracted. The statewide HUB goals are defined in 34 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §20.284.
- 5. Wage rate requirements will be required as shown in the Contract Documents.
- 6. Buy American Steel and Manufactured Products for Construction Contracts (See Special Notice to Bidders).

IV. Scope of Work

BASE BID

- A. DPS Hangar Structure (PEMB with Overall Dimensions of ~ 150' x 210' (~ 31,500 SF)
 - ~ 23,500 SF Hangar Bay
 - ~ 7,500 SF of Offices
- B. Access Drive Connecting to FM 490 and Parking Lot (PCC/HMAC) ~ 2,600 SY (3" HMAC or 7" Reinforced Tx 360 PCC, 10" or 12" of Tx247, Type A, Grade 1 2, 8" of Cement Treated Subgrade @ 4% Cement Tx275)
- C. Airfield Apron Pavement (PCC)
- D. Security Fence and Access Gates
- E. Storm Sewer Infrastructure -Consists of a number of inlets, junction boxes, some concrete flume, and RCP pipe.
- F. Utility Relocation (2 AT&T Lines)
- G. Expanding a Section of an Existing Detention Pond Located midfield west of the runway.
- H. Aerobic Septic System

V. Site Access / Staging Areas

- A. Site Access and Staging Area
 - Contractor staging and storage area shall be at the location shown on the phasing plan in the plan set. (Sheet 08). Contractor staging area includes job trailer, material storage, employee parking, etc.

a. A temporary gate and temporary drive will be required to access staging area. The gate will need to be closed and secure or a watchman at entrance at all times.

VI. Safety and Phasing Plan

- A. Contractor will be required to be in compliance with FAA Advisory Circular 150/5370-2G, Operational Safety on Airports During Construction.
- B. Contractor will prepare a Safety Plan Compliance Document (SPCD) that outlines how they intend to comply with the established Construction Safety and Phasing Plan requirements. The SPCD acknowledges the safety requirements and how the requirements will be met.
- C. Traffic Control Required for Constructing Access Driveway to FM 490. FM 490 is an active FM road.
- D. Traffic Control Required on the Airside adjacent to Taxiway
- E. DPS frequently operates helicopters, which can cause airborne debris. Foreign Object Debris management will be highly stressed during construction.

VII. Other Information

- A. Contract Time
 - 1. 300 Calendar Days for the Base Bid.
 - 2. No additional contract time will be added if any alternates are awarded.
 - 3. Liquidated Damages are \$5,000 per calendar day beyond contract time. (<u>The amount associated with Liquidated Damages will be changed to \$1,000 per calendar day via addendum.</u>)
- B. RPR Office (Reference C-105 Specification) The RPR trailer can be separate or a dedicated space in contractor's job trailer. Requirements can be found in the C-105 specification.
- C. Materials Acceptance by Owner / Materials Quality Control by Contractor (Reference C-100 Specification/Contractor Quality Control Program) KSA only performs Construction Materials Acceptance Testing. Failed testing will be the responsibility of the contractor.
- D. Protection of any existing utilities in the project area is the responsibility of the Contractor. Engineer has endeavored to show all known utilities within the Contract documents, but this shall not relieve the Contractor from full responsibility in anticipating all underground obstructions, whether or not shown on the plans. Contractor should call for utility locates and verify locations of all utilities prior to starting construction.
- E. SW3P Contractor is responsible for filing the NOI with TCEQ. Contract documents include items to facilitate the control of stormwater runoff, but ultimately, it is the responsibility of the contractor.
- F. Engineer's Construction Estimate
 - 1. Base Bid = \$8,651,275
 - 2. Additive Alternate No. 1 = \$150,000

TOTAL Base Bid plus Add. Alt. No. 1 = \$8,801,275

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Notes:

- Unclassified excavation is subsidiary to the unit price for that item, and off-site removal is the contractor's responsibility.
- 2. <u>Buy American requirement is for materials/products manufactured and assembled in America, not to be</u> confused with Buy America.
- 3. Hook-up of utilities for the job trailer are the responsibility of the contractor.
- 4. Contractor is responsible for permitting fees, etc.
- 5. <u>Documentation of utility location The Contractor and RPR will be on-site to document utilities located by the</u> contractor.
